

## Group Competition Module™




**The Quiz Challenge** - *The Quiz Challenge* is a game that is similar to academic quiz bowl TV shows. It includes three rounds of eight questions. The question point value increases in each round (typically 100, 200, 300 points).



Who came up with the theory of relativity?

1. Einstein 50%
2. Hubble 33%
3. Copernicus 17%

**And The Answer Is...** - *And The Answer Is...* is a Jeopardy-like game that includes a master game board with 25 questions. Each question is presented in the form of an "answer" and participants are asked to select the "question" from a list of choices. Questions are grouped into five categories and increase in value from 100 to 500 points per question.
